She is the former Training and Outreach Coordinator for Best Start Social Marketing, where she directed several national breastfeeding promotion and support projects for the federal government, including USDA's peer counseling curriculum and training initiative and "Using Loving Support to Build a Breastfeeding-Friendly Community." She is also the former State WIC Breastfeeding Coordinator for Mississippi, and founding president and board chair for the Mississippi Breastfeeding Coalition.
